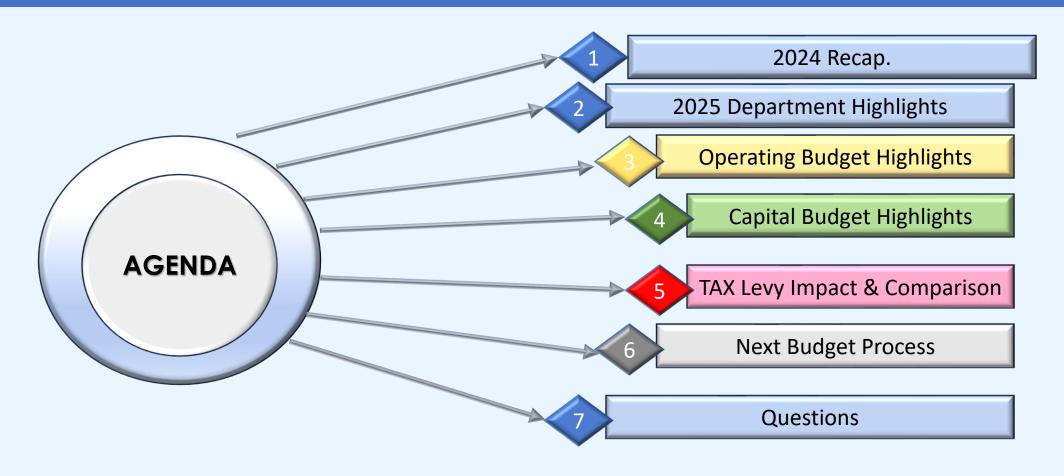

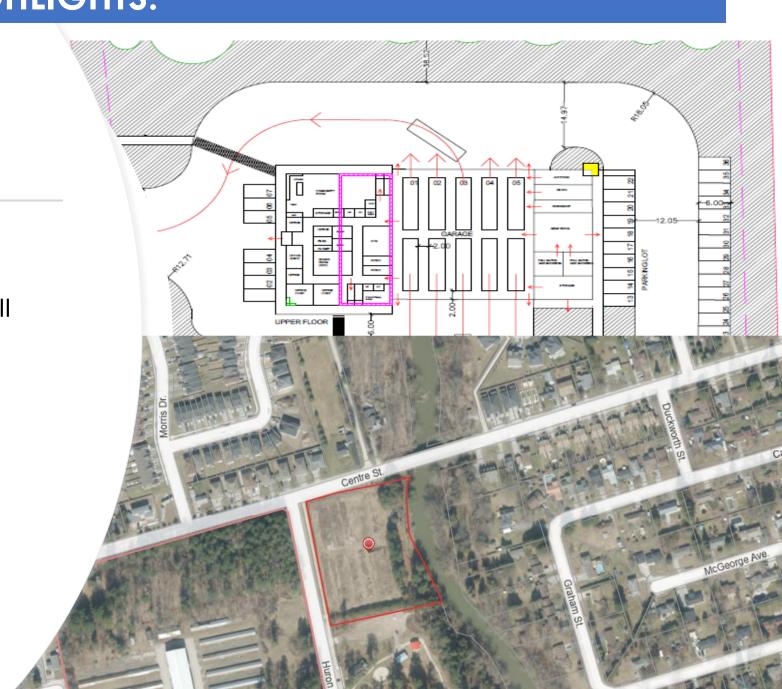

- Loss of 15% OCIF Fund (\$700,599 in 2025 compared to \$824,234 in 2024)
- Increase of 17.1% in OPP Budget (\$3,622,314 in 2025 compared to \$3,003,809 in 2024 Approx. 5.2% tax increase)
- Asset Management Contribution to come from taxation in the amount of \$931,600 (7.5%) compared to \$695,600 (5.7%) in 2024
- Slightly increase in the tax contribution to fund the Township Capital Program in the amount of \$741,863 compared to \$735,770 in 2024

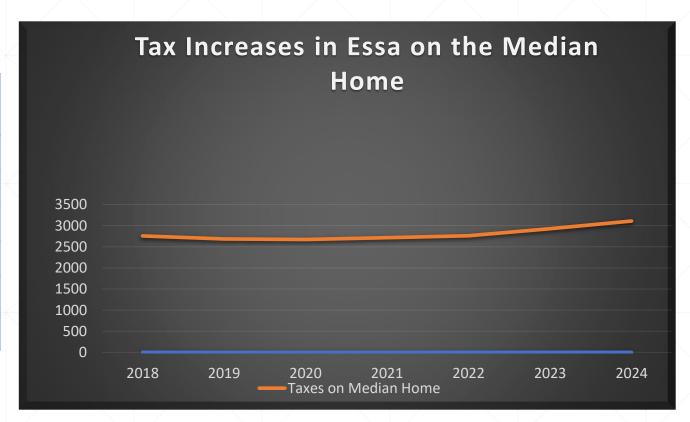

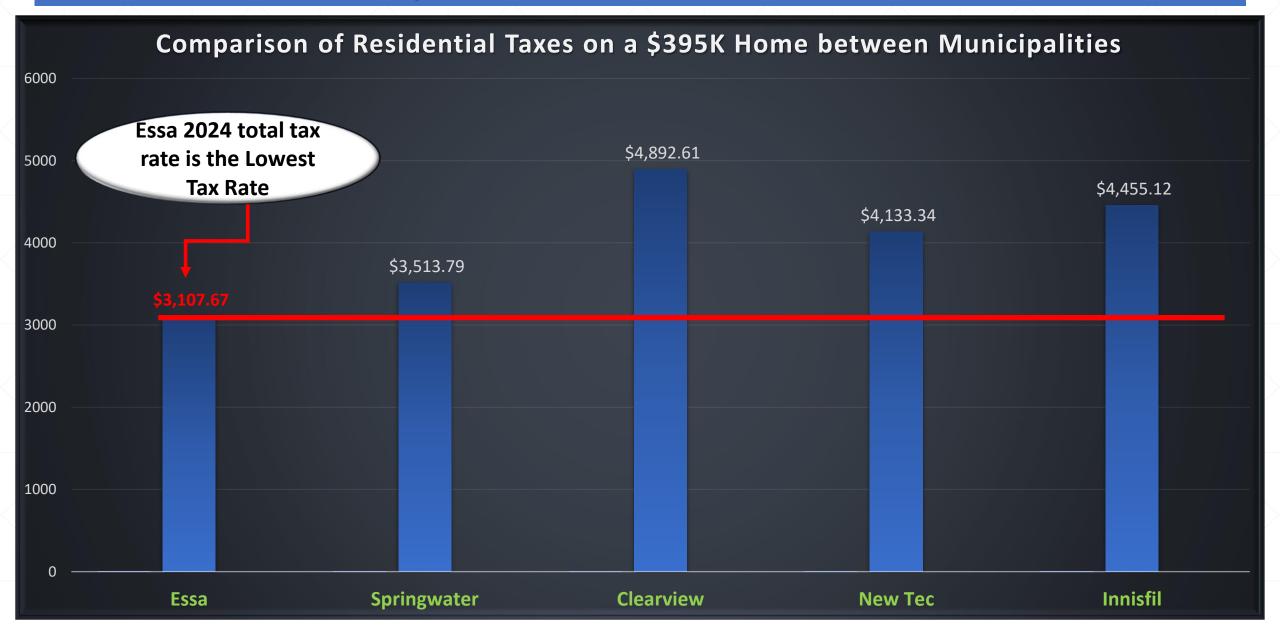

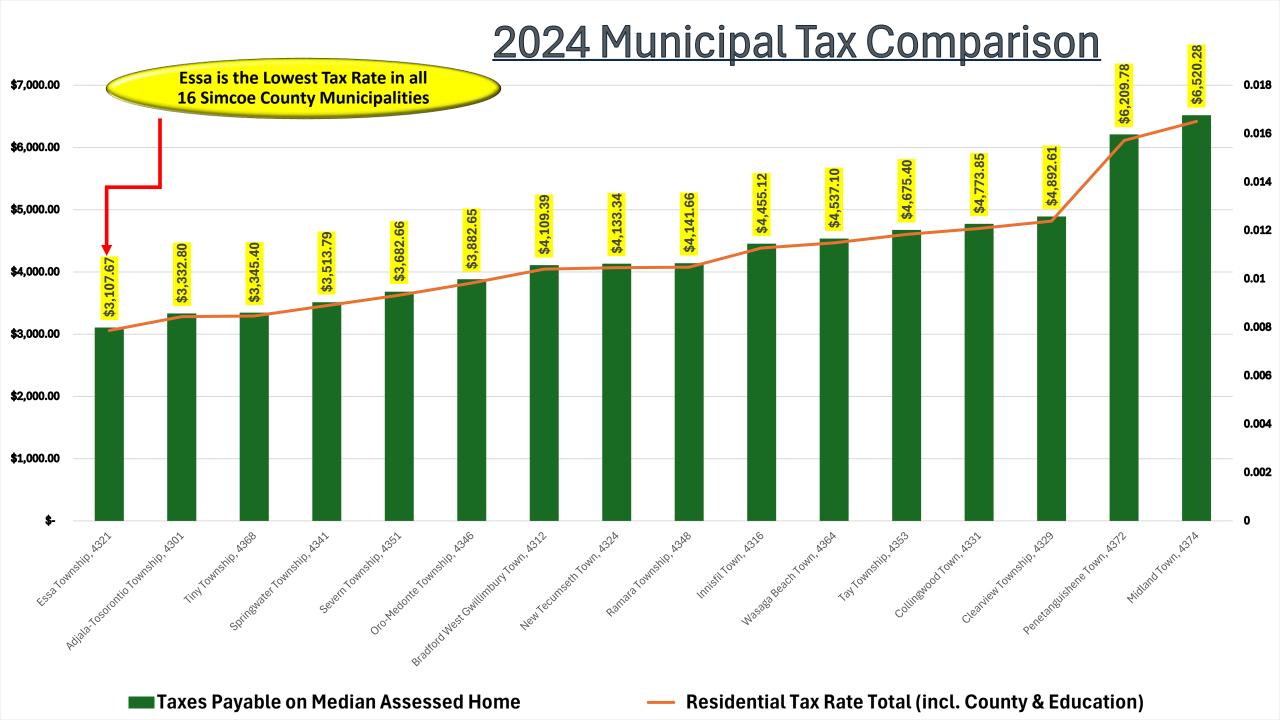

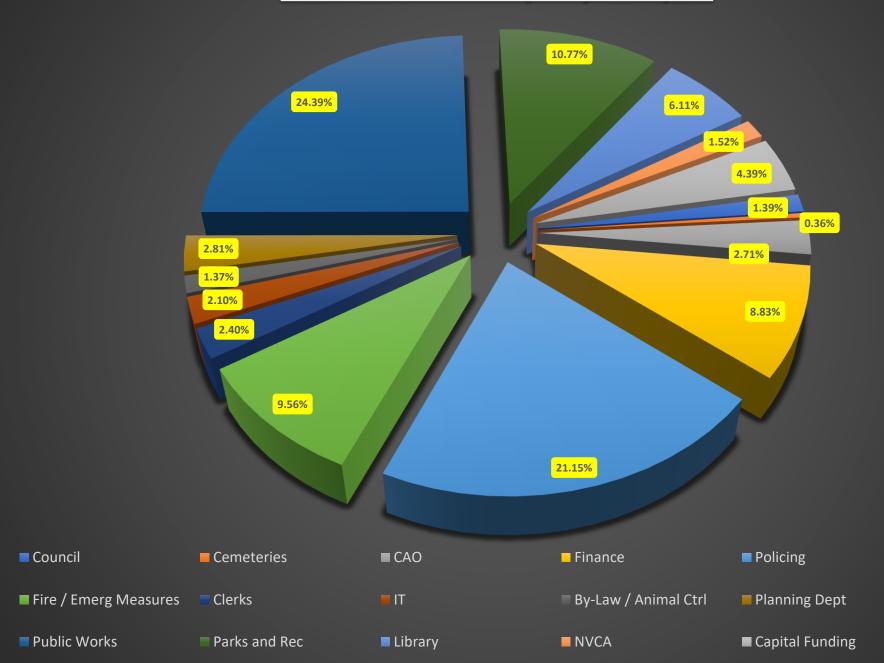




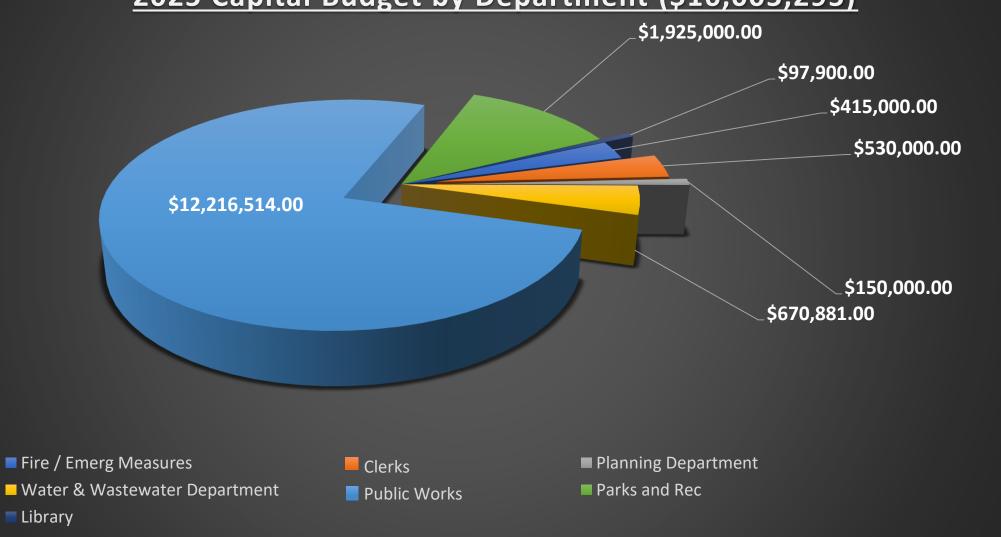
WHERE YOUR TAX DOLLARS ARE GOING IN 2025



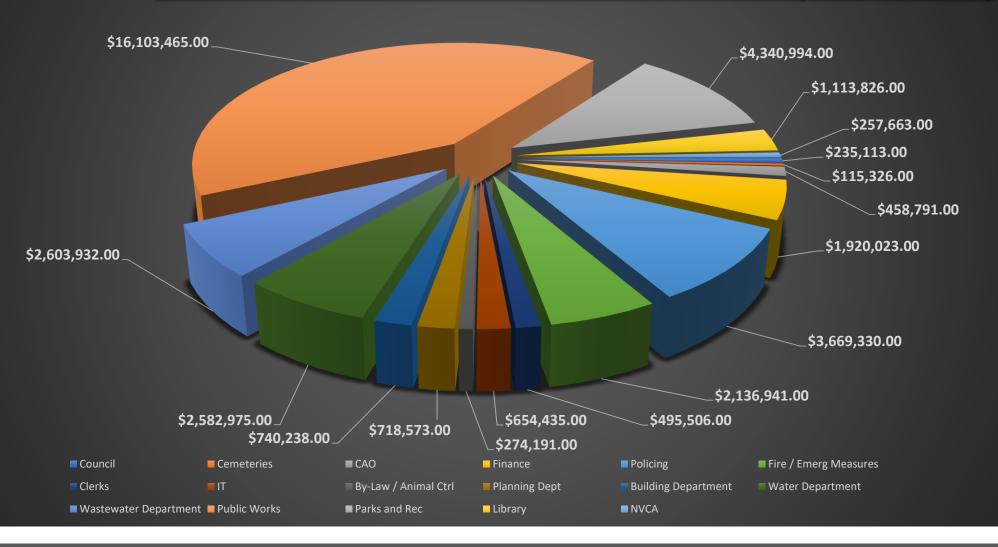
2025 Tax Levy by Dept.



2025 Capital Budget by Department (\$16,005,295)



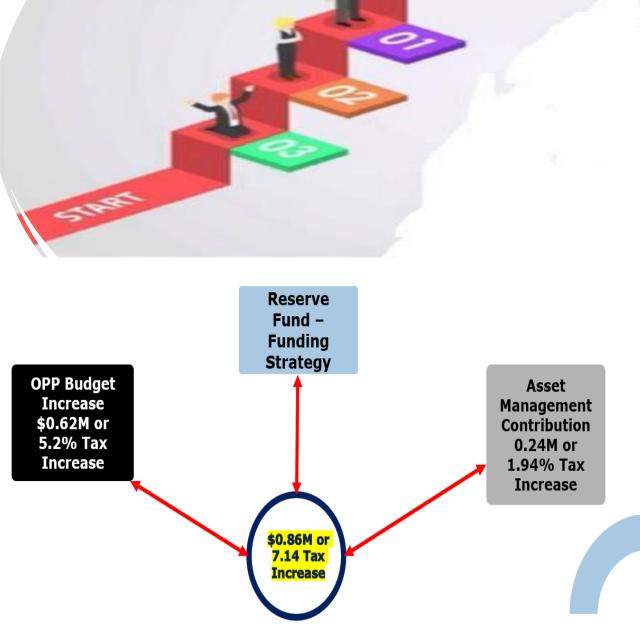
2025 OPERATING EXPENSE BY DEPARTMENT (\$38,421,322)
