A By-law for the imposition of fees for Water and Sewer Service [Repeals By-law 2021-07]

WHEREAS Parts II and XII of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, permit municipalities to enact by-laws imposing fees for various services or matters; and

WHEREAS at its meeting of October 1, 2025, Council of the Corporation of the Township of Essa in the Council of the Whole to approve the Water and Wastewater Rate Study by Watson & Associates, authorizing an annual rate increase of 4.00% effective January 1, 2026 for 2026; January 1, 2027 for 2027; January 1, 2028 for 2028; January 1, 2029 for 2029; and January 1, 2030 for 2030; and

WHEREAS Council deems it advisable to establish fees for water and sewer services:

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Essa enacts as follows:

- 1. That Schedule "A" attached hereto sets out the fees for 2026, 2027, 2028, 2029 and 2030 for water and sewer services and forms part of this By-law.
- 2. That By-law 2021-07 is hereby repealed.
- 3. That this By-law shall come into force and take effect on the 1st day of January, 2026.
